

IN MEMORIAM RITA ANN MORSON 31st March 1939-30th April 2022





Rita was born in Southampton and attended St Benedict s School, Andover with her elder sister Barbara. When Rita was 14 they moved to Nottingham for her father s work. He was an aviation engineer and worked on Merlin Engines. Later in life he worked with Gordon Barrett, who many Link readers will know. Rita s dream was to become a ballet dancer, but she followed her father s wishes and attended Pitman Secretarial College. This served her well in her various jobs as a PA and a School Secretary. Besides dancing, Rita loved poetry and was a member of the u3a Poetry Group. She gained a BA Honours and an MA in Classical Studies with the Open University.

Rita would have said her greatest achievement was the founding of the *Shalom Group* with Rev'd Harold Fisher following the successful ecumenical *Fully Human, Fully Alive Course.* An active Member of St Theresa s Parish, taking first Holy Communion and Confirmation Groups, she was also a Eucharistic Minister and Brentwood Pastoral Representative. She worked tirelessly with Churches Together in Stansted and the Stort Interfaith Group to open dialogue and break down barriers between people of faith.

Rita was a loyal friend who would always be honest and empathetic. She was devoted to her family, David, Simon, Sophie, and now little granddaughter Phoebe. In the last 11 years of her life she showed immense courage and determination after a tragic car accident and then with the onset of dementia. She wrote a book about how she managed to walk again after the accident which was a great inspiration to others; she even began adult ballet again at the Graham School of Dance, and joined the Tai Chi Class at Henham gym. Sadly, she was never going to win her last battle, but was beautifully looked after in Conewood Manor Care Home, Bishop's Stortford and passed away in my arms on 30th April. www.swchoral.org.uk

Our next concert on Saturday 16th July 7.30pm in Saffron Hall features Carl Orff s Carmina Burana and Jonathan Dove s Arion and the Dolphin. This marks a new era for the Society, as we warmly welcome our recently appointed Musical Director, Quintin Beer. Carl Orff composed several works for the theatre and concert hall, but he is chiefly remembered for his far-reaching contribution to music education and for his dramatic cantata, Carmina Burana, written in 1936. The text is taken from a large collection of secular poems of the 12th and 13th centuries, preserved in a manuscript at the Bavarian monastery of Benediktbeuren. Willy Moloney from Farnham has written a book: Carmina Burana: A medieval florilegium, published in 2014 to accompany the SWCS concert and to raise funds for the society. The book offers a further explanation of the text and will be on sale at the concert.

Jonathan Dove s *Arion and the Dolphin* begins with a singing competition in Sicily. Arion wins the prize, which puts his life in danger. His newfound wealth excites the greed of the sailors who are returning him to Corinth, and they threaten to kill him. They allow Arion to sing one last song, and the power of his singing attracts dolphins to the ship. At the end of his song, he jumps overboard, and one of the dolphins carries him to safety. Arion's musical gift gets him into trouble, but it is also his salvation. The concert also features the percussion ensemble, *O Duo and Friends*, and as both *Carmina Burana* and *Arion and the Dolphin* require a children s choir, we are delighted to welcome St. Catharine s College Girls Choir to join us. PHARMACY UPDATE

Additional NHS licensed dispensing pharmacy in Stansted A comprehensive report is now in the hands of Essex County Councillor (ECC) Dr Gogerty, Director of Wellbeing, Public Health and Communities and Ms Dipti Patel, ECC Primary Care and Pharmacy Lead, which considers the background and current licensed pharmacy provision in Stansted, amongst other considerations. As I mentioned previously, 664 people signed my petition during January 2022 supporting the need for an additional pharmacy.

What is the process? ECC representatives make recommendations to NHS England, the decision makers, based upon the ECC Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment report which will be published in October. Many of you not only signed my petition, but also completed the ECC online survey. THINGS TO DO AND PLACES TO SEE

5 Windmill

6 Hatfield Forest

THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

I am writing these words on the Monday after the long Jubilee weekend. It was great fun, but I never want to eat a sausage roll again as long as I live. What with Paddington Bear and all the parties, it is easy to forget that the word 'Jubilee' comes from the Hebrew word yobel and is a thoroughly biblical concept. It is all to do with how time is measured in the Old Testament. Every seventh year was a Sabbatical, which meant that agricultural land was left fallow. At the end of seven Sabbatical years (ie every 49 years), there was a Jubilee a Sabbatical of Sabbaticals. According to the Book of Leviticus, a Jubilee year saw the release of Hebrew slaves and prisoners, and the cancellation of debts. It was a time, scripture declares, when the mercy of the Lord would be particularly apparent.

It got me wondering about the amount of debt owed by Commonwealth countries to the UK. With a little help from Google and the Office for National Statistics, I found out the figure is £858.2 million. Of that, £585.1 million is owed by four African countries. Uganda tops the list, owing Her Majesty's Government a whopping £411.1 million. A biblical debt cancellation would be over twice as expensive as the actual national cost of the Platinum Jubilee, which came in at £408 million pounds. So it was probably never a go-er. However, I wonder what more manageable acts of mercy we might be able to exercise as individuals and communities as we move on from our own Jubilee celebrations, and look to the future?

TRASH TALK – PLASTIC

Even if you do not consider yourself an environmentalist, I am sure you are aware that plastic is a big issue for our planet. Plastic has its uses; however we greatly overuse it. We have become a throw-away culture in which we use plastic once (eg food packaging or water bottles) and discard it without a second thought. As you may already know, the problem with plastic is that it cannot decompose; in fact all plastic ever produced is still here on Earth



Unfortunately, recycling cannot be the single solution for fixing the plastic crisis. This is because only some plastics can be recycled, and the process takes a great deal of energy. Therefore, we should not just recycle some plastics and carry on producing and consuming plastics as usual. The main way we should tackle the plastic crisis is to make plastic-free swaps where we can; in this way we can help prevent even more plastics from getting into our environment. Below is a useful table showing alternatives to plastic products.

Plastic	Alternative
Sponges	Loofah
Hand washing dispensers	Soap
Dishwasher detergents - packaging	Smol etc./bought in cardboard
Coffee pods	Recyclable or make coffee in the old-fashioned way
Tea bags	Tea bags without plastic (Clipper) or leaf tea
Meat from supermarket	Buy from butchers and take own containers
Vegetables from supermarket	Buy from markets, eco shops and/or farm shops
Shopping bags	Reusable bags
Bottle	An environmentally friendly reusable one
Milk	Get milk delivered in glass bottles
Plastic cutlery	Consider carrying personal reusable cutlery
Plastic straws	Reusable straws (eg metal)
Synthetic clothing	Choose items with natural fibres (like cotton and linen) and/or use microplastics guard like the Guppy Bag or Cora Ball

THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY www.hundredparishes.org.uk

There are thousands of village halls in England, owned and run by local councils, churches or independent trustees for the benefit of local communities. The Hundred Parishes has its share, with a great variety of buildings and history.

The oldest could be in Hunsdon: it dates from the 15th century and was once a school (see photo below). Barley's 16th century building - once a guildhall - still looks ancient, while Westmill has a converted 17th century barn. Ashdon claims to have the only local thatched village hall, which dates from the 17th century. Radwinter's hall is part of village redevelopment in the arts-and-crafts style after a disastrous fire in 1874.

Many purpose-built village halls appeared after WWI, funded either by public subscription or a generous benefactor and often built as a lasting memorial to those who died in the conflict. Ugley's hall was built in 1920, funded largely by the local Tennant family, while Blackmore End in Wethersfield benefited from the generosity of Samuel Courtauld.



Several halls have been converted from their original use: Wethersfield has a second village hall, part of what was once a brewery. Little Chesterford, Hempstead and Stocking Pelham have found new life for their old schools, while Chrishall and Stebbing re-purposed former churches. Hildersham's village hall started life as a WWI army surgical ward and was brought from Cambridge.

Our village halls are greatly valued and used by all manner of community groups for meetings, sport and exercise, preschool activities, cultural performances, quizzes, exhibitions, farmers' markets and so on. We see new village halls appearing quite regularly, for example at Manuden in 2014, Great Hormead in 2015 and Duxford in 2020. Some are now referred to as community centres but we all know what they mean.

QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE COMMUNITY EVENTS 2022

e start this month by thanking everyone who came to our events at the Recreation Ground to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee at the start of June. The bank holiday weekend got off to a perfect start with the lighting of the village's Jubilee Beacon on June 2. Rob, Oliver, and Freddie shared the honour of lighting the beacon while the U3A Choir sang new and traditional anthems at this hugely popular event.

Two days later, our Community Picnic at the Rec proved even more popular with over 2,000 residents attending throughout the afternoon. Young and old turned out to enjoy the stalls, live music, and kids' entertainment as we joined the nation in marking 70 years of the Queen's reign.

We would like to thank councillors, volunteers, and all the community groups and local business who came together to

put on the event. Special mention should go to Brohmon, Bear & Eden, the Cork House, East Herts & North West Essex Pop-up Play Village, and the W.I.

The Parish Council would

also like to thank the bands, musicians and singers Shakila K, Jay Williams, Milla, Delusions of Grandeur, Moonshine Coyote, DJ Mckenzie for stepping up, some at short notice, to provide the live entertainment and making the day one to remember.

CASH FOR THE COMMUNITY

• ach year the Parish Council reserves money from its budget to satisfy grant funding requests from organisations and charities in our community - in 2022 this sum totalled £6,000.

The first tranche of grants was awarded by our Finance and General Purposes Committee in March. The Stansted Millers (£500), Uttlesford Community Travel (£1,250), Stansted Hall & Elsenham Cricket Club (£500), and TouchPoint (£1,150) were all beneficiaries.

In May the F&GP committee approved two further grants. One for £500 was awarded to Human Roots, which works to improve mental health in the community by helping people get involved in gardening an allotment. A second grant was offered to Uttlesford Citizens Advice (£1,120) to support their work offering help on debt, benefits, and legal and family issues.

Properly constituted organisations can apply for a grant by emailing us and informing us of the size of grant they'd like, how their organisation benefits the community (along with an indication of how many people they help), and a copy of their most recent accounts.

ROAD MAP FOR ROADWORKS

he summer months see utility companies and road work crews taking advantage of the warm, dry conditions to catch up on repairs to pipes, cables, and tarmac postponed by the long, dark nights and chilly conditions of the British winter.

This can add up to a pile of road misery for residents. In May the village suffered road closures to both Cambridge Road and Church Road that saw major diversions brought into play. We endeavour to keep residents informed of roadworks around Stansted by posting traffic updates on our website and social media channels.

Posts link to Essex Highways' future and current live roadwork map. This contains the most accurate informa-

tion on road closures or traffic restrictions. It not only details diversion routes, but also contains the permits issued by Essex Highways that signpost when scheduled roadworks begin and end.

Essex Highways say road works cannot be extended beyond the date that appears on a permit, but closures can begin earlier than the listed start date. When this happens the public must be informed of the change by, for example, putting out additional signage.




Roadworks can begin earlier, but not end later, than the dates displayed on a Essex Highways permit

MOUNTFITCHET GREEN

o ensure our programme of improvements for Mountfitchet Green keeps on track, the Parish Council is seeking approval for a long-lease agreement from Uttlesford District Council.

Currently Mountfitchet Green is owned by the District Council who are responsible for the upkeep of the area. A lease, if



The lease will, we hope, be granted for 20 or 100 years at a cost of £100 annually in ground rent. The extra maintenance would average £800 a year. This, we believe, would be money well spent, better enabling the Parish Council to deliver on its promise of improving Mountfitchet Green for its residents.

DEFIBRILLATOR FOR WALPOLE

• undraising efforts to get a defibrillator on the Walpole Meadows estate paid off in May when this vital piece of life-saving kit was installed at the District Council Building on Hornbeam Way. Walpole Meadows resident Alison Bradnick crowd-funded the £1,500 sum to pay for the defibrillator, with District Councillors Alan Dean and Geoffrey Sell chipping in from their New Homes Fund.

Almost 30,000 people a year die of a sudden cardiac arrest outside a hospital. Defibrillators can boost a person's odds of surviving a sudden cardiac arrest from 5% to 50%. The defibrillator at Walpole Meadows means the village now has 8 such devices accessible to the public 24/7. There are several more dotted around Stansted that can be called upon dur-

> ing the opening hours of the premises at which they are located (see map overleaf).

The British Heart Foundation keeps a directory of defibs around the country called The Circuit. This is visible to NHS emergency services. Using The Circuit they can direct not just ambulance crews, but also

members of the public to the nearest device when dealing with a cardiac event. We would encourage all Defibrillator Guardians to check their device is registered to The Circuit.

It is worth stressing training is not needed to operate a defibrillator. Spoken instructions are provided by the device which are easy to use. Also do not wait for an ambulance if a defibrillator is close to hand. Dial 999 and get an access code. The sooner a Defib is used, the better the chances of survival.

Climate Change

Environmental issues have become an increasing concern. More and more of us have become aware of the fragility of our planet. Sir David Attenborough has warned that "we are at a crossroads". The decisions we take now will have lasting impacts. Pre-Covid, I visited SE Asia on several occasions. I became acutely conscious of this fragility and the harm we are doing to our environment, whether it was coming out of a hotel in Hyderabad, India and having to hold my nose because of the smell coming from the polluted river, or being informed in Malaysia it was just as well you were not here last week, we had really bad smog, caused by deforestation in neighbouring Indonesia.

So what has Uttlesford done about climate change? In 2019 we declared a climate emergency. Councillors pledged to take local action to contribute to prevent a climate and ecological catastrophe through the development of practices and policies, with an aim to achieve net-zero carbon status by 2030 and to protect and enhance bio-diversity in the district.

At the last Scrutiny Committee we received a progress report. Although some progress has been made much needs to be done. It was disappointing that out of the £1,000,000 budget allocated for climate change only £80,500 has been committed or spent. The Leader of the Council admitted that insufficient officer resources had been allocated. It was also disappointing to learn that our recycling figure stands

at 47.9% This rates us at 105th in the council recycling table. The highest rated council in Essex is Rochford in 8th position with a rate of 61,8 %. Maldon on 8th at 58.9% Colchester in 21st at 56.7%.

On a positive note the council has launched a new Environmental Services newsletter. The first edition of the 'Reduce, Reuse, Recycle' newsletter included information on changes to bin collections as well as details about recycling and food waste. Letter Ball

This is a drill which I have given before, but it is so powerful it is worth repeating it, with variations:

- Get a tennis ball; with a black marker pen write some big, clear letters on it
- Throw the ball to a partner, staring at the ball watching it land into your hand/s. Shout out the letter you see landing. No guessing Watch your partner and make sure they really are staring at that ball as they catch it
- If possible, throw the ball without a spin, so your partner can see the letter approaching. If no partner, you can throw the ball against a wall
- Move to catching with one hand
- Now move to catching it using one eye
- Then, for extra pizzaz, one partner shouts *left* or *right*, and the other person has to catch with the hand opposite to the one shouted so if the call is left, catch with the right hand.



This is one very powerful neural drill The visual system is the prime system and roughly 32% of total brain activation is dedicated to processing visual information, which is staggering. When you add in catching with the opposite hand, you add in frontal lobe inhibition. This part of the brain is what makes us unique in the animal kingdom. It sits at the front of the brain and one of its many jobs is to inhibit initial reactions. So, throw the ball to someone's left hand and shout out *left* means their frontal lobe has to inhibit the natural desire to catch with the left hand and catch with the right instead. After a bit, change the shouter. Revenge can be sweet.

The Stock Clamp project progresses. Our millwright, Paul delivered the main parts in May and they are now safely stowed on the 1st floor in readiness for installation, hopefully during July. Paul then marked out the positions of every-thing on the stocks and started some preparatory adjustments to the sail frames. The clamps are large timbers which will be fixed to each side of both stocks (the large cross timbers which support the sail frames) at the centre. Their job is to strengthen the stocks at their weakest point and to ensure that if one were to break the sail would not fall to the ground (as happened at another nearby windmill a few years ago). 
