#### Are you Missing out?

If you are facing higher living costs, there may be extra sources of income and support available. If you are, for example, out of work, or on a low income, or disabled, you may have a right to claim benefit entitlements, and sometimes claiming can also help you access other support. You can check what benefits you might be entitled to by using an online benefit calculator such as: www.uttlesford.gov.uk/article/5078/Online-Benefit-Calculators or telephone us.

#### **Pension Credit**

Lots of people who are entitled to Pension Credit are not claiming it. This gives you extra money to help with your living costs if you are over state pension age and on a low income; it is *separate from your state pension*. You could also qualify for other financial support, such as Housing Benefit, a free TV licence and other means-tested benefits. You can claim Pension Credit online, over the phone or by post and will qualify for a higher amount if you are severely disabled or a carer. You can easily check if you are eligible online www.gov.uk/pension-credit-calculator or telephone us.

#### Benefits for families

Child Benefit gives a big boost to your budget. You can claim this for each child you are responsible for. Payments are tax-free as long as neither parent or carer earns more than £50,000 a year. People who have an income between £50,000 and £60,000 will be taxed but will be better off claiming Child Benefit and paying the tax than not claiming benefit at all. If you are off work looking after your child and not paying National Insurance contributions, then claiming Child Benefit will make sure you get credits towards your state pension. If you have just had a baby, make sure you claim before they are three months old. See www.gov.uk/child-benefit/how-to-claim.

#### **BRAIN TRAINING**

Want to do something differently? Make a better choice? Most decisions we make we take with a minimum of, or no thought at all. 'Shall I have a biscuit/s with my tea?' 'When this happens, I immediately get annoyed.' 'Why am I always so nice to people – why can't I say no?' These decisions happen super quickly. To change, it is a matter of practising how to dab on the brakes and do it differently. It is called inhibition. Last month we explored the letter ball drill of catching the ball with the hand opposite to the hand called,



which practises this inhibition. How to practise inhibition alone? You could download a *Stroop Test* app. It will be variations on this: a word naming a colour pops up as in this picture; the correct answers will be the colour of the printing: blue, pink and green. You will have to overcome the desire to give the answers red, green,

blue. Doesn't that sound simple? To prove that I don't know my onions, download the app, give it a whirl and report back.

There are various forms of the app. The two I use are The Stroop Effect on Apple and Stroop Tests for Science on Android. Find a few minutes a day to do the app and in due course you will find that you can take that nano second to do it differently. This is not going to happen having done the app a mere once or twice! As an added bonus, those of you who exercise on an exercise bike can do the app whilst you are pedalling away. This is called Brain Endurance Training (BET); terrifically effective.



#### HARVEST IN STANSTED

Readers of this publication may recall a very active and lively front cover last October, of farmers bringing in their crops. The photograph was taken by Peter Webb and he has kindly sent some more pictures this year. The first interesting point is that this year's photos were taken right at the beginning of August, which is incredibly early to harvest crops in our area. Peter points out how very lucky it is that the regulations changed many years ago, and farmers are no longer allowed to burn stubble in the fields; can you imagine how dangerous that would be in a summer such as this one?!

Originally booked to speak to the Club in 2020 when Covid struck, members enjoyed the long-awaited talk called *Seeds* - *Spread to Survive* by Anne Lauder. Using a PowerPoint presentation, photographs of seeds were enlarged and seen in detail. How plants have adapted to their surroundings, temperature and fauna was explained and discussed. Anne showed the different methods used by plants, trees and shrubs to spread their seeds. Some are spread by wind or water, or by birds and animals digesting the berries and depositing the seeds some distance away; others hook onto animals or clothes (the *velcro* seeds), and others shoot their seeds away from the mother plant, as much as 200 ft away!

One pleasurable autumn task is the harvesting of ripened fruits from trees in your own garden. For most of us, our cooking apple will be a *Bramley's Seedling* and the dessert apple an Essex-bred *Discovery* or a *Cox's Orange Pippin*. Originating from central Asia, apples are incredibly varied with at least 2,000 named varieties! There are 150 named varieties in the gardens at Audley End. In the 19<sup>th</sup> century the skilled horticulturalists at the Rivers Nursery at Sawbridgeworth bred and propagated many varieties of fruit trees, including the prolific *Czar plum* and *Conference pear*, both of which are still available today. The *Conference pear* features in Great Chesterford's 21<sup>st</sup>- century community orchard.

For commercial reasons, the range available from modern plant nurseries is limited to a few easy-to-grow varieties. However, hidden away in forgotten corners of long-established gardens within the Hundred Parishes there are specimens of heritage varieties of orchard trees. If you have a flavoursome, but unidentified, variety, then the East of England Apples and Orchards Project would be delighted to hear from you; see www.applesandorchards.org.uk email: info@applesandorchards.org.uk or call 01328 838403. There is something special about growing a unique or local variety, so if you wish to plant heritage fruit trees specific to your own county, the organisation's catalogue lists a surprising number of varieties for Essex, Hertfordshire and Cambridgeshire apples and pears, as well as local plums, cherries and gages. This wide selection provides an opportunity to continue a long tradition of choosing something rather special to enjoy eating in

future years. The *What's On* page of our website often displays local apple events, for example on **Sundays 4<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> September** at Rivers Orchard in Sawbridgeworth, and on **Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> September** at The Gardens of Easton Lodge.

## THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

I still remember the long hot summer of 1976. I was 9 years old, and my memories largely involve playing football in the park, and my mother insisting I drink plenty of water. I do not recollect sun cream being a thing, but I do recall my father being very concerned about the grass and the garden. I remember in church we were asked to pray for rain, and it did. Now we have had another long hot summer and whilst I have played a lot less football, I have been the one concerned about the grass and the garden. Without water everything withers and dies. It may look okay for a while, but eventually it all dies without water. Water is a precious resource which we, in this country, are often guilty of taking for granted.

In John's gospel we read two statements Jesus made about himself.

Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them. Whoever drinks the water Laive them will never thirst. Indeed, the water Laive them will become in

Whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life.

Jesus used these pictures to help us understand both our need of him (it is like being thirsty and needing water) and his ability to satisfy our spiritual thirst through the Holy Spirit. I do not want my spiritual life to look like my lawn – dry, dead and disappointing. I want it to be flourishing and full of life. Unlike my hosepipe, there is no restriction on anyone having relationship with Jesus, and there is no shortage; he will satisfy anyone who asks.

A reminder of our fête on Bank Holiday **Monday 29<sup>th</sup> August** 1.00-5.00pm round the mill and on the Recreation Ground.

If you passed the mill during the week beginning 11<sup>th</sup> July you would have noticed a lot of aerial activity as our millwrights fitted stock clamps to the sails. The process involved a lot of manual winching to lift the heavy clamps 50 ft up until they could be attached and held in place by four specially made galvanised steel shackles. Each pair took a day to fit, so by the end of Tuesday both pairs of stock clamps were in place. Thankfully, it was the week before the record temperatures but it was still very warm; it was a particularly impressive effort from all involved. On the Wednesday and Thursday new wind boards and 16 new shutters were installed. All the shutter bays are filled; there are no gaps now and as a result the sails should turn in lighter wind than they did before. ## PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

...with news of Skatepark Jam 2022, efforts to introduce restrictions on HGV traffic, a consultation with Foresthall residents on the merits of possible waiting restrictions on the estate, plus an update on progress being made to revamp recreational spaces in the south of the village



#### **STANSTED SKATEPARK JAM 2022**

he skatepark in Lower Street car park once again plays host to arguably Uttlesford's premier skateboarding event. The day-long Stansted Skatepark Jam on Sunday, September 4 has a busy schedule of competitions to get through:

- 11:00 Under 10s
- 11:30 Scooter
- 12:45 Inline
- 13:45 Skateboards
- 15:00 BMXs

There will be a sound system, while caterers I Am Dumpling will be serving up food. If the sunny blue skies of 2021 are repeated, the sight of the ice cream van will no doubt go down well with the crowds of attendees and competitors.

Stansted's Skatejam has gone from strength to strength in recent years. Hundreds now turn out to watch the park's top skateboard, BMX and rollerblade talent compete each year. So much so that the event's organiser, Seann Tompson, is being tapped for tips and advice by representatives



from other authorities in the district keen to replicate the event's success for their own communities.

#### LORRY RESTRICTIONS INCH FORWARD

he much discussed introduction of weight restrictions on roads into Stansted to reduce the volume of HGVs passing through the village is inching closer to reality.

Lorry traffic through Stansted, especially along Grove Hill and Chapel Hill, has been a long standing source of complaint for Parish Councillors and residents alike. In December's Link we informed readers of Essex Highways' proposal to tackle the problem.

Their preferred solution calls for the use of camera technology to monitor lorries passing through Stansted. The cameras would identify HGVs exceeding weight limits so vehicle owners could be penalised.

At the Parish Council's last Highways Sub-committee in July, Essex County Councillor Ray Gooding updated on the scheme's progress. He reported that the Uttlesford Local Highway Panel will fund a £25k feasibility study to assess whether weight restrictions in Stansted would impact negatively on nearby roads. It is expected the scheme will encompass all entry roads (bar the B1383) and will require the erection of advanced warnings signs.

One barrier must be overcome before the cameras can be rolled out. Remote hand-held cameras, as well as ones in fixed locations, are seen as the best option for enforcing the scheme., but their use requires Parliamentary approval. Waiting for the necessary nod from Westminster could take time.

## ZEBRA CROSSING FOR SILVER STREET

F ast-moving traffic can be perilous for pedestrians crossing from one side to the other of Silver Street. The Parish Council at the start of 2022 submitted an application for a pelican crossing to be constructed near Blythwood Gardens. Uttlesford Local Highway Panel has instead decided to sign off on a zebra crossing for Silver Street, rather than a pelican crossing. A time-frame for the installation of the zebra crossing has yet to be announced, but work on its design is underway.

Meanwhile, plans by the Parish Council to improve the flow of traffic further up from Silver Street, along Cambridge Road, sat with Essex Highways for several years after they were submitted. The design team at Essex Highways recently notified the Parish Council that for reasons of affordability the scheme - which included the creation of a parking bay near the Wood Grill - will not go ahead.

## WAITING RESTRICTION SCHEMES

A t the last Full Council meeting before the August recess, Parish Councillors ratified the recommendation by the Highway Sub-committee not to proceed with an application to the North Essex Parking Partnership for a Residents' Parking Scheme on the Mountfitchet Estate.

Red lines may still be introduced on certain road junctions on the estate to ensure bus routes remain passable and safe. The Parish Council wishes to clarify that parking on grass verges on the corners where red lines exist will not be permitted. Car owners who do so risk a ticket.

The application for waiting restrictions on the Mountfitchet Estate to the NEPP required a process of consultation with residents by the Parish Council. Now a similar exercise is needed to assess support for the introduction of waiting restrictions on the Foresthall Park estate.



As a first step a working group

consisting of 3 councillors and 3 residents is to be set up to oversee the consultation process. Options will be set out to resolve traffic and parking issues affecting Foresthall. The consultation will offer an avenue for residents to feedback their views on any proposed measures. The Parish Council will publish details on the consultation process on its website as well on its social media channels. Residents directly affected by any proposed options will also be letter dropped to ensure they have every means of having their voice heard.

## SEARCH FOR FIREWORKS SITE

The Events Working Group continues to explore options for a site to host the village fireworks. Stansted has limited spots suitable for an event of this kind. Health and Safety requirements dictate a location be large enough to accommodate the large crowds, that is not too close to homes, trees and vegetation to pose a fire risk, while having sufficient road access for the emergency services. In 2021 the Parish Council lost access to its traditional site at Forest Hall School. Other sites put forward last year did not meet the criteria but a different site has been suggested and is being looked at. Look out for an announcement if a site has been found in next month's edition of The Link.

## TRIM TRAIL FOR WILKIN'S CRESCENT

ast month's installation of a trim trail in the play area of Wilkin's Crescent marked the end point in the Parish Council's project to improve the play areas and recreational spaces of Foresthall Park.

The process of improvement got under way in May 2021 with a consultation of residents near the play spaces of Reeve Road, Walson Way and Wilkin's Crescent. Since then significant investment has been made in play equipment

and furniture for all three locations.

Community project grants from Uttlesford District Council, money from the Welcome Back Fund along with use of Section 106 money for the Foresthall estate has been used to buy benches, picnic tables, and a trim trail as well as to pay for the reintroduction of play equipment that had



been previously removed from the Reeve Road play areas. The trim trail at Wilkin's Crescent has gone down well with youngsters during the school summer holidays since it opened.

A good deal of headway has also been made in rejuvenating nearby Mountfitchet Green. Here money from the Welcome Back Fund, which aims to help communities in their post-Pandemic recovery, and other grants, have been invested in new benches, a picnic table, a zipwire, and a disability swing. Other improvements over the last 12 months include the repainting of lines of the Multi Use Games Area, and the purchase of new nets for the MUGA's basketball hoops.

#### WELL DONE, EMMA

Congratulations to Deputy Clerk Emma Philbrick whose 11 month's of hard work paid off with news she had passed her CiLCA qualification and is now a certified Parish Clerk!



And the improvements will not end there. The Parish Council has been working closely with the Essex Forest Initiative to co-ordinate work to fill out the hedges around the Green. In the future the Essex Forest Initiative is to plant several trees in this location too.



The pace of regeneration will hopefully pick up again once Uttlesford District Council fi-

nalise issuing a lease to the Parish Council for Mountfitchet Green. Once this is issued we can consider further improvements to the Green as a whole.

## DISTRICT COUNCIL NEWS



#### Stansted Airport Appeal Decision Review Report

Many Uttlesford Councillors suffered a profound shock on the first day of Stansted Airport Ltd's appeal against Uttlesford's Planning Committee's decision to refuse the planning application for the airport to expand up to 43 million passengers per annum. District Councillors were astonished when the council's legal representative told the Inquiry that Uttlesford would now agree to the application's approval, subject to certain conditions, known overall as "Condition 15".

As Stansted residents will know, the upshot of this voltefaceled to the Planning Inspectors granting approval for the expansion and awarding costs against the council, on the basis of its unreasonable behaviour by causing a costly appeal at which UDC didn't defend its decision to refuse planning permission. A further costly legal appeal by the council to the High Court asking for the inspectors' decision to be overturned was dismissed by the judge on the grounds that the case was "unarguable". Recently the District Council has made an offer of £1.4m to Stansted Airport to cover their costs. This was on top of the £1m+ that the council had spent determining the application and fighting the appeal. It is not yet known whether the airport will accept this offer. After the appeal process ended, District Councillors agreed to set up a group to review how the planning process went so disastrously wrong, and was so badly run, it would seem.

In July the council considered a report from a planning lawyer who said the Planning Committee had acted "politically" and the decision-making process used in preparing the appeal case was flawed. The report said there was systemic failure at both officer and political level. Some councillors said that the report was incomplete and missed out several key pieces of information.

The report also said the appeal strategy should have been considered by an Emergency Meeting of Council, but no

such meeting was called. A sorry saga! Cllr Alan Dean has written about the shortcomings of the review on his blog: alandean.mycouncillor.org.uk

#### Uttlesford population increased by 14.1%

The 2021 Census results showed the population of Uttlesford increased from 79,000 to 91,300 between 2011 and 2021. This is higher than the overall increase in England of 6.6%. Both East Herts and South Cambridgeshire increased by around 9%. For more information, see www.ons.gov.uk/visualisatons/censuspopulationchange/E07 0077/

Local Plan consultation finally commences on 2nd November

There is no doubt that the population of the district will continue to grow rapidly as the new Local Plan for the period up to 2040 has to comply with a Government target of building 706 houses each year in the district.

The delayed draft of a new Local Plan, which will indicate where the District Council leadership consider the new houses should be built, is now due to go out for consultation on the 2nd November. It was originally due to appear in May. We already know Stansted Mountfitchet has been identified as one of the three main Rural Centres in the district.

#### Planning service remains designated

The government has written to the District Council recently advising that the Development Control function will continue to be designated in respect of the consideration of major planning applications in Uttlesford.

The original decision to designate the council was made in February and related to the number of major applications overturned on appeal over a rolling two-year period. It means that applications for major development – more than 10 houses or over 1 hectare – can be made directly to the Planning Inspectorate, although applicants still have the option of applying to the council in the usual way should they wish. It is unlikely that the designation will be lifted in the near future.

#### Cost of living crisis

The council has recently provided additional Council Tax benefit worth at least £100 to some of our least well off local residents,. This is on top of similar changes Cllr Khan successfully proposed for other groups in need at the budget meeting in February, all as part of the Council's local contribution to combating the Cost of Living crisis everyone is facing. The council is also out to public consultation on continuing with the most generous Council Tax relief scheme in the whole county, under which some of the worst off local people get 87.5% knocked off their Council Tax bills – so please let Uttlesford know what you think about this at www.uttlesford.gov.uk/article/7926/Have-your-say-oncouncil-tax-support-scheme.



Fête Grants: The Jubilee events in June raised more than £3,320.78. The Parish Council has donated this sum to the Stansted Trust Fund, which provides grant funding to community groups and individuals in the village.

The title of our talk at our meeting in July was Boom and Bust in Medieval Lavenham. Jane Gosling, former National Trust manager of the Guildhall in Lavenham and director of the Suffolk Architectural Heritage Trust, explained how the fortunes of picturesque Lavenham derived from weaving its own best-selling brand of sturdy cloth dyed a distinctive shade of blue. The clothiers became very wealthy men and the town became a hub of prosperity and employment; it drew in supplies of raw wool from other areas of the country and beyond. However, their heyday was short-lived as in the second half of the 16<sup>th</sup> century the market became flooded with finer, more fashionable Flemish cloths imported from the Low Countries. The sudden loss of income meant that the clothiers' fine timber houses were never pulled down and replaced according to the taste of subsequent centuries though some had Georgian or Victorian facades applied.

It was good to welcome Keiran Olivier to our July meeting and hear about the wonderful work being done by Human Roots Community, the charity she founded. A qualified chef, Keiran grew up in a family which grew their own vegetables. She decided to apply for a grant to help schools design a garden where pupils could learn to grow things, and local schools have been very supportive. She is particularly interested in helping children with special needs. They have a large number of vegetable plots at the Elms Farm allotments, and during Covid, managed to grow and package over a ton of vegetables! She is always looking for volunteers to keep it all going; see the Directory of Local Clubs and Organisations on p 35 if you are interested.

As promised Keiran then produced a large glass terrarium for her Horticultural Demonstration. Into this she put a mixture of stones, dried compost, activated charcoal, purifier and soil - something should grow after that! These plants all flourish in a damp environment, but did need the addition of a slug or two and a variety of insects. Some members decided they would rather do without these, but I presume this makes a garden ecosystem. It looked wonderful but sadly was too large and too expensive to go into our raffle. The WI will be providing tea and cakes at the Windmill Fête on 29th August as usual. Our next meeting is on Thursday 8th September at 7.30pm in the Day Centre; do join us for an evening out, a talk on Wellbeing, some cake and a chat. Visitors are always welcome, as are new members.


