## **Editorial**



This issue is unusual in that it contains no obituaries. It rather bears out the old adage that a green (or soft) winter makes for a full churchyard. However, the significant factor in most of the lives that we have commemorated is the high degree of service and compassion which they record. A place that contains people with these qualities is one to be valued. It has some relation to size but also the period that residents remain in Stansted has a bearing simply because time enables relationships to grow. The anonymity that characterises larger and highly mobile communities has so far not become apparent here, which must say something for us.

The approaches to any town or village create a lasting impression on both visitors and residents. Stansted is fortunate in that its four main access roads are rural and devoid of unsightly buildings. The southern route on the B1383 is particularly attractive with bordering trees and parkland culminating in weather boarded houses and the windmill. We note that Brooklands is now likely to change hands and express the hope and concern that its pleasing threshold to the village will remain.

## THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

## WOULD HE PASS THE TEST?

'Passing the Test' is the title of the forthcoming Lent reflections organised for Churches Together by St John's Curate, Giles Tulk. Based on the book by a former Holy Island warden, David Adam, these meditations explore the significance of the testing Jesus faced immediately after his baptism. How often, in crisis, we say: "These things are sent to try us"? A young Muslim firmly told me, "God put us here to test us"!

Our elder daughter, Elaine, aged 32, recently shocked us by saying she has breast cancer. This is the second time she has had cancer. A friend asked me whether this did not severely test my faith in God. I put this to our daughter, who texted back: "There are no answers. All I know is that God is with me, whatever happens". Rabbi Harold Kushner, in 'Why Bad Things Happen to Good People' wrote that asking "Why?" leads nowhere. Instead, from his personal experience of family tragedy, the more positive step is to decide: "Now that this has happened, what do I do?"

According to Old Deuteronomy – not T S Eliot's poetical cat – his Hebrew ancestors endured the 40-year trek through the wilderness as God wanted to see how far their obedience would go. Defending the ways of God often proves unsatisfactory. In 'Letters and Papers from Prison', Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrestled the question of God's omnipotence coming hard up against Hitler's destruction of Germany. Bonhoeffer concluded that, though in his distress Man looks to an all-powerful God to put things right, "only a suffering God will do". Instead of asking humanity, perhaps ask God, "Will *he* pass the test of life?" Faith is less about getting answers than learning to live with the questions.

## **Ancient and Modern Aspects**

Visitors to St Mary's will have noticed that Stansted Hall Estate has recently removed trees and undergrowth from the eastern and much of the northern lengths of their boundary with the churchyard. This has restored the outlook from the church land to the open view which was shown in Humphry Repton's Red Book of 1790. In those days Stansted Hall was situated only a hundred yards to the north-east of the church and was a very different building with corner turrets. The then Mrs Fuller Maitland disliked it and went to live in Stansted House on the other side of the valley, so it was no surprise that the old house was demolished and replaced in 1871 by the present Hall. The footprint of the former Hall is still discernable on the ground. Sir Thomas Middelton's funeral in 1631, which featured in Audrey Rodgers' descriptive talk to the Local History Society in February, is likely to have taken place in these surroundings (but with wooden crosses instead of stone memorials and absence of the 1692 church tower).

The Haiti earthquake is one of several recent natural disasters to which people have responded generously. A large part of the donated money has been channelled through the Disasters Emergency Committee, of which Christian Aid is a member. That money will be used for the immediate needs of Haitians. When the terrible images have faded from our television screens, aid agencies will still be working in Haiti as they are in other countries. But then they can work on teaching people to fish rather than doling out fish. "Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day. Teach him how to fish and you feed him for a lifetime" (Chinese proverb). Christian Aid provides the means for its partners on the ground to give people the skills, tools, education to look after themselves.

That is why in May (9th –15th) people in Stansted will be knocking on doors collecting the distinctive red envelopes with contributions to this vital work. Unfortunately at the moment there are not enough collectors to cover all the roads in Stansted, particularly as new roads are added each year as the village grows. So, this is an appeal, not for money, but for man (and woman) power. Please let me know if you can deliver and collect envelopes in your street, or elsewhere in Stansted. It takes a short time, but can make a huge difference to the lives of people like those affected so devastatingly by the Haitian earthquake.



## ROTARY CLUB OF STANSTED STORT VALLEY

The Rotary Club of Stansted Stort Valley has been considering the deserving causes which should benefit from our Christmas Sleigh collections. In spite of the poor weather, which meant we had to cancel two evening collections, an amazing £5,200 was given by the generous people of Stansted, Thorley and Bishop's Stortford. The beneficiaries include a number of local youth oriented organisations. As you probably know, Rotary is an international community of local clubs that aim to help people who find themselves in less fortunate circumstances. Recently Rotary has supported the international relief effort following the catastrophic earthquake in Haiti - by supplying 'Shelter' and 'Aqua' boxes



which provide emergency shelter, cooking essentials and clean water. BBC 'Look East' featured these boxes which provide basic life support in the immediate aftermath of disasters. Stansted Stort Valley Rotary has provided six boxes at a cost of nearly £2,000.

## THE NOSTALGIA COLUMN

## FROM THE MILL ARCHIVES

From Mrs A E Nicholls, Bristol. To Mr Ladbrooke, Stansted. Dated 8th September 1969.

"A line to thank you very much for your kindness in sending me the book of the dear old Mill at Stansted that I remembered so many years ago and watching the sails go round. What a giant he seemed to me. I played on one of the sails in 1881 blown down by a gale - that was a year for gales and storms, also a Comet. I shall treasure the book and read it at leisure - plenty of time at the age of 93.

I was only seven when we left Stansted to live at Bishop's Stortford and the chief reason was that we had to go to the pump near the Mill for water. You see my parents lived at the \*Rose and Crown when they first married and two of us were born there but when the third was coming along we moved to a cottage at the back of the Crown garden. I do not know if they still stand - there were two villas as you turned right at the top of Mill Hill - two villas and a row of cottages at the back of the Crown gardens. My grandfather, Sam Snow, was the licensee (a shoemaker by trade) and my mother, Susan Snow, met my father, a young man, with a gang sent down from London to repair Maitlands mansion. They used to get down to the Crown in the evenings. They married and had ten children of which I am the eldest and there is only myself and brother left and he is now 90 and still lives at Bishop's Stortford. I don't think many people took the Crown after Grandfather who went back to Elsenham and his old trade shoemaking. I used to go in the carrier's cart to stay with them and loved it.

I have had a letter, answering my letter, from Miss L Gold who lived opposite the Crown, related to the Blyths and Gilbeys. I remember Sir Walter (Gilbey) passing with his beautiful horses, no coachman riding postillion, and Sir Walter sitting back in his carriage very proudly. By the way, Gilbey's pint bottles of whisky and brandy were 3/6d in those far off days.

I hope I don't bore you with my memories of Stansted which are still very vivid. When my Grandfather died my Grandmother went to live in the Maitland Almshouses (in Church Road) facing the Park. Stansted was only a small village in those days. Thank you for telling me about the old school; we had our treats in the Castle hills."

Another piece of paper attached to the copy of the letter above is unsigned but was probably from Mrs. Nicholls' brother as it reads "I was born in 1876 in a P.H. called the Rose and Crown at the bottom of Pines Hill. It was later turned into cottages and stables for the gentry who lived opposite. I can still remember the shops I had to visit: Maskells the butchers for steak that was 10d per pound and Green & Marsh the grocers. Our school was in Chapel Street (Hill) opposite Woodfields. I know the old windmill still stands. I wonder if the sails are still there. I was very happy at the idea that the third London airport should be at Stansted was dropped."

Note - \*The Rose and Crown Public House was then at what is now known as Crown House, Silver Street.

## REVIEW OF COUNCIL'S HOUSING ALLOCATIONS POLICY – HAVE YOUR SAY

A complete overhaul of Council house waiting lists is in the pipeline, and people are being asked for their comments. The public are being asked for their opinions on Uttlesford District Council's plans to shake up the way council houses are allocated across the district. The Government recently published new statutory guidance on social housing allocations for local authorities that aims to address the lack of awareness and understanding about allocations, and to tackle misconceptions.

For years, social housing in the District has been allocated on a points system, with each prospective tenant assigned points depending on their circumstances. According to the Council, many prospective tenants are unhappy with the 'difficult and complex' points system. The Council is keen to use a housing allocations policy that works for everyone and best meets local needs and circumstances, which is why they are asking for your views. By taking part in the consultation you can help choose a fair system that will prioritise housing for those that need it most and strip away the confusion surrounding social housing allocation. The discussions will last until the end of April, with a new policy in place by May. ## 'Make your mind up on second runway', Government tells BAA

The Government minister responsible for dealing with BAA's plans for a second Stansted runway has asked the airport operator to state whether it still wants to continue with its current planning application. John Denham, Secretary of State for Communities, has also told BAA that if it does still want its second runway application to be considered, then the information provided when it submitted the application almost two years ago will need to be updated. The planning application documents stand more than ten feet high, which gives an indication of the amount of work that would be involved in bringing the information up to date. The 'make your mind up' message is contained in an open letter sent on 10th February by the Secretary of State to BAA, Stop Stansted Expansion (SSE) and other interested parties. The letter also states that if BAA does still want its second runway application to be considered, the Public Inquiry cannot start until after the next General Election which must be held no later than 3rd June. Significantly, both the Conservatives and the Liberal Democrats are pledged to ditch any plans for a second Stansted runway.

SSE has been pressing the Secretary of State over the last year to bring an end to the present blight and uncertainty by having the second runway planning application withdrawn, although recognising that this is something only BAA itself can do. We strongly welcome this intervention by the Secretary of State. We are very pleased that the Secretary of State has now put the ball firmly in BAA's court by asking it to state its future intentions regarding its second runway application. BAA has spectacularly failed in its original intention to secure planning approval for a second runway before the next General Election, despite having had the present Government's blessing for the development since 2003. A lot of water has gone under the bridge since then, and if BAA does decide to go ahead it must make a start on updating that ten foot pile of planning documents. The blight and uncertainty has gone on for far too long.





Our February meeting took the form of a Members' Evening, when the speakers are drawn from within the Society. Barry Francis started off with a guessing game - a friend had bought an item in Norfolk, kept it in his garage for about 20 years, then sent it to him, saying as a historical item, it was about time it returned home to Stansted. Barry gave us several clues and eventually we discovered that it was a brass plaque donated to St Mary's School in 1911 to celebrate the coronation of King George V.

Audrey Rodgers followed with an account of one of Stansted's most famous residents, whose memorial is in St Mary's Church. This was Sir Thomas Middleton, and his funeral took place on 8th September 1631. Born in 1550, he went to London, where he became involved in the spirit of discovery of that time - he was a founder member of the East India Company and the Grocers' Livery Company, and held high office in the Court of Elizabeth. He also became Lord of the Manor of Stansted Mountfitchet. As you might expect, his funeral was an auspicious occasion, celebrated with great pomp and included three days of feasting, all of which Audrey described in detail.

Roger Barrett then spoke about Captain Alan Coulston Gardner, who married into the Blyth family in 1885. While in the Army, he was attached to the staff of Lord Chelmsford, who led the campaign during the Zulu Wars. The force having been divided, Captain Gardner was sent with orders for them to rejoin, arriving just as the detachment was annihilated at the battle of Islandlwana. He himself behaved bravely and was one of the survivors. Roger described the battle and Gardner's part in it, as a result of which he was appointed ADC to Major Buller, who later was involved in the Boer War. Although 25 years difference in age, both the Captain and his wife were very fond of big game hunting. He and his youngest daughter are buried in St Mary's Churchyard.

Derek Francis also had a quiz for us. In a town 164 miles away, the roads are named Stansted, Elsenham, Bishop's Stortford and other names familiar to us and we had to guess where they were. Derek himself had done a great deal of research to find the reason why the names had been chosen and it seems that in 1904, a paper mill had been built in Grimsby. In the vicinity, houses for the workers had been erected. The principal owner of the mill was Sir Walter Gilbey and all was clear!

Finally, Paul Embleton showed us photographs of seven of his most recent postcards of local views, which we were very interested to see. As usual, we were most impressed by the expertise which our members showed and were grateful to them for putting together such an interesting programme. At our next meeting on 4th March, Brian Williams will be asking the question 'Oswald Moseley: Brilliant Insider or Evil Outsider?' - do come and find out. See you then.

# ANNUAL PARISH MEETING 24th MARCH 2010 - 8 pm.

Please join us for your forum at the Free Church, Chapel Hill.

Along with The Link you should have received the papers for use at the Annual Parish Meeting which describe the work of the Council, a financial Review and future objectives.

In addition there will be a presentation relating to the Parish Plan and the recent questionnaire as well as an exhibition in the lobby on re-equipping and developing the play areas following discussions with manufacturers and after site visits.

## **PARKING RIGHTS AND WRONGS**

The clarification and enforcement of parking regulations concern many people, with parking on pavements causing much irritation. The Parish Council is convening a meeting with the Police and Uttlesford District Council (responsible for parking attendants). Following this meeting it is hoped to publish details of what regulations will be enforced and where.

# DO YOU WANT TO BECOME A PARISH COUNCILLOR?

Following the resignation of Gaye Ellington after her marriage, there is a vacancy to be filled on the Parish Council. The vacancy will be advertised on the noticeboards. If more than one candidate, then Uttlesford District Council will call an election. If there are no candidates then the Parish Council will use its power of co-option. May we take this opportunity to thank Gaye Ellington for her contribution over the past three years and to wish her the very best in her new home.

## COPING WITH THE COLD WEATHER

For many weeks the weather has been very wintry with plenty of snow, frost, mist and rain. For most of us this is little more than inconvenient. However, we would like to thank Gerard Frogley

for his continuing efforts to keep the parish tidy and always with a smile.

Although criticising the efforts of councils is common and can be justified, it is only right to thank the work-force of Essex County Council who gritted the main roads and footpaths in the parish. Compared with the position in Bishop's Stortford we were well served. A Snow Summit has been convened by ECC during March to consider the out-turn and look to learn lessons for next winter, if necessary.

Whilst Tesco carrier bags are marked as biodegradable, they are actually not fully compostable and cannot be used in the brown bins. Please use newspaper or cardboard to wrap your food waste, or the bags available from Uttlesford, the Parish Council Offices, the Co-Op and other outlets at £4.99 for a roll of 50 bags.

And finally ...... dog mess. The two beautiful nature reserves are walked by many people, with or without dogs – please be responsible and clean up after your pets.

### **TREES**

Whilst most people realise that consent is required to undertake work to trees bearing Tree Preservation Orders, we would like to remind readers that consent is also required if you live in a Conservation Area. If you live in such an area and are planning to undertake any work to trees, please contact the planning department at Uttlesford District Council (planning@uttlesford.gov.uk) BEFORE you start work.

### STANSTED YOUTH CENTRE

The centre is now back into full swing after the Christmas break and the dreaded snow!!!

The numbers are good and the young people are excited at the projects that they have got planned for this year.

Just before Christmas 6 young females took part in a 6 week Emotional Wellbeing Course, they enjoyed drama, dance, art and discussion all based around different feelings and how we cope with them. For their participation they will receive an Essex Youth Certificate.

The young people have began work on the Mosaic and Mural project that is going to brighten up the outside of the centre and our storage unit. These murals will depict well known landmarks around Stansted and from Northern Ireland where the young people visited last year. The mosaics will be of the young people themselves and the hobbies and activities they enjoy taking part in, like BMXing and fishing. The young people are also learning about Gaudi and his famous mosaic's and how mosaics first started with the Romans. It is then hoped if funding can be sourced to take some of the young people to Barcelona in June to see Gaudis work for themselves.

With Spring hopefully nearly here the garden project will again be bursting into activity again with the initial clearing and cleaning and then planting and caring. Plans for the garden this year is construction of a giant chess board made with paving slabs for outdoor chess games and a barbque area. Our garden crew led by Tom Williams have been eager to get started and the fact that the trees surrounding the garden have been drastically cut back during the winter means less leaves to clear prior to planting and more light for the plants to enjoy.

Spring also sees our Belfast friends first visit to Stansted. 30 young people from 2 youth centres

are coming to spend a week with us to see how our youth centres operate and what life is like in Essex. The young people come from the two areas of Belfast that have seen lots of sectarian unrest and are part of the reconciliation process so we hope to make their stay with us as enjoyable as possible.

By having them stored in the house they can be deployed at very short notice to block the water coming through the front and back doors or to prevent the unpleasantness of lavatories overflowing. They effectively act like a giant sized nappy.

One kit called DoorPac includes size 4 FloodSax® (38cm x 38cm) + 1 FloodSax® (100 x 20cm)

Each FloodSax® weighs 0.5kg when dry & 12kgs when energised. Capable of absorbing 12 litres per FloodSax®

Each pack comes vacuumed-packed and contains 5 FloodSax® and will protect a single door against water up to a height of 6 inches.

## **NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD D.C.**

I have had good news from Essex Police about parking on pavements. They are to run a campaign with leaflets to persuade people to be more considerate about where they park their cars, whether that is on yellow lines or across pavements and grass verges. Please look out for publicity on the campaign as your help may be needed. I have had complaints about inconsiderate parking in Lower Street which I have passed on to the police.

The intended developer of the old school house next to the Free Church in Chapel Hill is based in Epping. He told me in early February that he aims to start work in February. Fingers crossed!

I know that some people feel aggrieved that the 510 bus from the airport to Stortford and Harlow does not come through the centre of Stansted. I have used the 510 and walked from Pesterford Bridge, but that would not suit many people. A review of the 7/7A bus is currently underway so I have asked whether this bus could be extended up Church Road to Walson Way when that road opens. This would then provide an interchange with the 510. I have complained about the poor timekeeping of the 301 bus. There seems to be a defect in the timetable that needs sorting out.

Uttlesford has been trying to save costs by running some service in a partnership arrangement with other councils. This means that costs such as management and computers can be shared and so duplication can be cut out. Car parks are already managed this way under an agreement with Braintree and Colchester councils. Since last summer discussions have been underway with South Cambridgeshire to join together the two councils' teams that collect taxes and pay out benefits. At the end of January the deal seemed to fall apart when South Cambs asked for what appeared to be terms that suited them but would be unreasonable to Uttlesford. As I write at the start of February the deal seems to be in the balance, but I am keeping my fingers crossed that common sense will prevail on both sides. After all, if upwards of £500,000 of taxpayers' money can be saved each year for as good or better service, then the two councils should do all they can to bring off the deal. (Cllr Alan Dean)

## **Temporary Accommodation-Manor Road**

At the last meeting of the Community and Housing Committee members considered a report which advised councillors to revaluate the use of land in Manor Road. Instead of providing short stay emergency accommodation it was resolved that the garage site would be used to provide two permanent two bedroom social housing units. Two units of council accommodation at Molehill Green, Takeley have been identified as an alternative use of emergency accommodation. Officers have had discussions with Chelmer Housing who have confirmed that the garage site, Manor Road can provide two permanent two bedroom houses. This is the type of accommodation in most demand by those registered on the Housing Register.

## Citizens' Panel

It is vital that Councils engage with their residents. One of the ways this can be done is to set up a Citizens's Panel. I have always been a keen advocate of this and am glad it is finally seeing the light of day. The Citizens Panel a consultative body made up of residents in the district, which is representative of the district as a whole in terms of age, ethnicity, gender etc. Officers have been working to establish a Citizens Panel for Utllesford. It is likely the panel will contain 500 people. About 200 people have already expressed an interest. The panel would work by sending our four questionnaires a year, initially by post but then asking if members wish to be consulted on-line instead. It is intended that the panel commences its work during the financial year 2010/11. ## ANIMAL WEIGHT AWARENESS MONTH

Animals are brought into the surgery in the strangest of containers. I've seen cats in laundry baskets, hamsters in shoeboxes and even dogs in picnic baskets. The variety of boxes used can be quite interesting. I quite often start morning surgery wondering how many toasters, kettles or computer printers I'll be treating that day. However last week I saw the strangest container ever. I walked into the waiting room to call the next client through and was confronted by a rather small lady with a rather large black dustbin which seemed to be making sloshing noises. When I looked inside it contained a huge Koi carp! I wondered how on earth she had managed to get it into the waiting room in the first place, as there didn't seem to be anyone else around. With the help of Jo the nurse we managed to get it into the consulting room, by which time the water was swirling round in circles and the Koi was looking decidedly disorientated! Anyway we treated it and it seems to be making a good recovery but as I always say life as a vet is never dull and you can never tell what's going to come through the door next!

Unfortunately what I can guarantee I will see several of every day is overweight animals. March is weight awareness month at Mercer and Hughes and we will be making a special effort to talk to clients about weight issues in animals and will be offering free weight checks and dietary advice. The latest figures show that 40% of the UK dog population is overweight. That equates to over three million dogs. Cats don't fare much better with estimates of between 25-40% of cats in the UK being overweight. Personally, I find those figures shocking and rather sad. I'm sure people don't realise fully that all the health risks associated with obesity in humans are just the same in animals: heart disease, diabetes, arthritis and so on. I always say to people that there is really no excuse for our pets to be overweight as it is the owner that controls the food not the pet. Have you ever seen your dog in the kitchen opening a tin of dog food as a midnight snack? So, give us a ring or pop into the surgery and get your pet weighed and we can give you lots of advice about healthy eating and then you'll have a happier and healthier pet!





## **SKYWATCH**

A monthly look at an aspect of the Night Sky



The winter months, especially mid December to mid March, are the best for casual sky watching at sensible, early evening times. All stars, all countless billions of them, belong to one or other collections of stars called Galaxies. Our star, the Sun, belongs to a galaxy called the Milky Way. The name comes from a stretch of milky white that crosses the sky from horizon to horizon, though not many of us have seen it (including me) because of light pollution, though, if you know where to look, any binoculars will highlight the Milky Way. There you will see thousand of tiny spots, all of them individual stars. If you move the binoculars (or telescope, of course) around you will discover a split in the Milky Way. This is not actually a split but a vast cloud of inter-stellar dust that, itself, has to be measured in light years.

But what is the Milky Way? Most galaxies, and the Milky Way is one of them, are of a spiral shape with a central core and curved 'arms' of stars whirling round it. It's rather like

small birds but good for the raptors which benefited from the



fledglings makes great demands on the parents.

an octopus being spun by its head, although the galaxy actually spins once every 225 million years or so. When you are looking at the Milky Way, you are looking towards the centre of the galaxy where, demonstrably, most of the galaxy's stars are located. From Earth, we can only see three galaxies with the naked eye, and only one of them in the Northern Hemisphere which is called the Andromeda Nebula. 'Nebula' because it appears as a nebulous smear of light against the pin point stars. We didn't know it was a galaxy until the 1920s when the first seriously large telescopes revealed its spiral structure. The significance of this revelation was immense because we suddenly realised how huge the Universe was. The other two galaxies we see with the naked eye are in the Southern Hemisphere and are called the Large and Small Magellanic clouds. Each of them are irregular galaxies, a fairly rare type. We now know that the Universe is awash with galaxies: billions of them. All of them have gravity which influences others, and would all be in one lump if they did not spin. Centrifugal forces help keep everything balanced. Yet there appears to be a structure in the way galaxies are distributed. More next month, where we will consider odd things.





## CONSULTATION BY UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL ON HOUSING AND OTHER DEVELOPMENT

All households should now have received a questionnaire from Uttlesford District Council about its 'Local Development Framework'. From 15th February until 9th April the Council is asking, among other things, for opinions on the location of 4,000 new houses in the district over the next decade and beyond. Some readers will remember that two years ago four options were put forward for consideration, with the District Council stating its preferred option to be Option 4, a new 3,000-home new town between Elsenham and Henham. This new consultation is seeking views on where the balance of 1,000 houses should go to complete Option 4. But more importantly, in the last two years various technical studies have been carried out and each option for housing growth has been examined and compared. So the consultation also asks a question about whether Option 4 is the best one, or whether residents would prefer another option. Elsenham and Henham villages are of course still implacably opposed to Option 4. In response to the last consultation Stansted Parish Council also opposed Option 4 because of its detrimental effect on Stansted, particularly in respect of extra traffic through the village. Other questions in the consultation are about airport growth, business growth and local jobs and traveller and gypsy sites.

There is also the opportunity to respond on-line at: http://www.uttlesford.gov.uk/main.cfm?Type=CSCON&Me nuId=987. All the technical studies are also available at links from the same webpage and in paper copy at Stansted Library. Your attention is drawn to the Comparative Transport Analysis and the Comparative Sustainability Assessment. Do you agree with the scoring system in the latter analysis that narrowly rates Elsenham as the best location for most new housing? Do you agree with the assumptions used in this assessment? Tell the Council what you think.

Two Special Area Forum meetings are being held to discuss the consultation. The first is on Tuesday 2nd March at Helena Romanes School, Dunmow, and the second on Thursday 4th March at the Council Offices, Saffron Walden. Both meetings start at 7.30pm. Don't forget to respond to Uttlesford District Council by 9th April!

## HATFIELD FOREST HIGHLIGHTS

Hello everyone. We have been very busy over the winter in the Forest, with lots of exciting projects on the go including the massive changes to our marsh. Our marsh restoration project will make a big difference to our reed and sedge beds in this area. In recent years, willow and hawthorn scrub have intruded on to the marsh, shading out some of the smaller plants and reducing the amount of reed habitat for nesting birds such as the water rail. This project has employed a specialised team to cut, remove and dispose of the willow and hawthorn to allow the reed to re-establish. Once they have been removed, we will be able to look after the marsh and remove any future re-growth. We have also been hard at work on our veteran trees. In 2002 we carried out a detailed veteran tree survey of 800 trees. As each one is so important and unique, an individual management plan for each tree was drawn up. We are now using pioneering tree surgery called 'environmental arboriculture', mimicking the trees' natural process, balancing out the canopy, trunk and branches using specialised cuts. Without this work the veteran trees are at great risk of collapsing under the weight of the branches and their valuable habitat will be lost.



Another important annual project that many of you may have noticed by London Bridge is our wood pasture restoration. Wood pasture is an important habitat that is becoming scarce throughout Europe. During this project we are clearing one hectare of hawthorn scrub growth that has encroached onto what used to be pristine wood pasture, full of wild flowers. Forty potential pollard trees will be selected and kept. The majority of trees that are felled will be cut for firewood and left to season for two years before being sold off as logs. To protect the ground from damage, anything that needs to be burnt we will carry out on a burning platform. Following this work we will fence the area using dog-proof chestnut paling and then our sheep will graze this area for around five years to allow a greater variety of grasses and wild plants to grow. As always I hope you will come and find me if you have any questions and I look forward to seeing you on the forest soon.

# Planning Application UTT/1441/09/FUL, the Total Garage

Not all villagers are aware that the Total garage at the corner of Cambridge Road and Bentfield Road was subject to a planning application to demolish it and for 13, two-bedroom flats and 21 car parking spaces to replace it.

At least 327 villagers believe it would be wrong to impose more flats on our village and have signed a petition to help support objections to this plan. I'm sorry that other villagers, who might have wanted to sign my petition, did not have the opportunity. I simply ran out of time to knock on all doors. The following statement was included with the petition to the UDC Development Control Committee on 10th February:

There is a 'creeping' increase of multi-storey flats being built in our village which is changing and degrading the character of Stansted Mountfitchet. I fear we will follow Bishop's Stortford in their downward spiral as a consequence of the many flats recently built there and much disliked by that community. In Stansted Mountfitchet, between Windmill Close and Bentfield Road, there are already well over 120 flats/small properties about 50% of which have been built in the past 10 years. This planning application is now extending the possibility of even more high density multi-story urban flats being built to the north of Chapel Hill along Cambridge Road.

UDC Development Control Committee decided to reject this planning application. This was much supported by Stansted Mountfitchet Parish Councillors who are members of that Committee. What are the next steps? We have to wait for the applicant to respond. They might appeal, they might revise their planning application, and they might even withdraw it. We need to watch carefully what will happen. To all who signed my petition and encouraged me to take the action I have very many thanks.

## RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNERSHIP

What does it mean?

There are many things to consider as a dog owner; you have the responsibility to your dog and to the community around you, and it is important that we all should live in harmony and peace.

### Identification

Make sure your dog always wears a collar and tag when out in a public place. The Control of Dogs Order 1992 makes the tag a legal requirement, a microchip is just an extra precaution, but very useful. The animal warden can chip, so please ask for prices and arrange an appointment. Don't allow your dog to stray; it could be seized or, worse still, it could cause an accident.



### **Falling Foul**

ALWAYS clear up after your dog should it foul any footpath, park or public place; if children walk the dog make sure they are prepared to 'pick up'. Poop scoop bags are available FREE from the animal warden. Bags can (preferably) be taken back home and disposed of in your black-lidded bin. Also available to you are the RED dog bins or litterbins for waste tied in SMALL bags.

## Training

Ensure that your dog is trained, and can be controlled when you are out. This is very important as not everyone is a dog lover, and an uncontrolled dog could be a danger. Always keep your dog on a lead when near livestock, and respect the Country Code. If children are allowed to walk the dog make sure that they are able to control it.

### Noise

Don't allow your dog to be a nuisance to people living around you by making unnecessary noise; all dogs will bark but constant noise from them should be avoided. Anyone enduring a noise problem can contact the animal warden.

## **Control Orders**

Dog Control Orders will be enforced over the whole of the Uttlesford District to ensure that the possible risks of toxicara are kept to a minimum. Regular worming of your dog should also be carried out.

Please remember that all the above points are within your control, and a well-trained and socialised dog is a credit to its owner, not a worry.


